Arrival and Registration

Once you arrive at the Marylebone Campus, pass through the barriers, turn left, and go to room MG14 on the Ground Floor. Here you will be able to register your attendance on the programme and enjoy some light refreshments before the programme starts.

The University of Westminster website will appear which confirms your successful connection to the network. Once you are enrolled as a student you will then be able to access the university's <u>Eduroam Wi-Fi</u>.
