You can only submit ONE email, including your application and all relevant documents. You will not be able to amend your application once we have received it. You need to have a conditional/unconditional offer in place before you can apply for a scholarship.

Selection process:

Please remember that scholarships are limited. Meeting the eligibility criteria does not guarantee that you will receive an award.

All eligible applications will be considered by an awarding panel. The panel members understand that applicants will have a broad range of differing skills, attributes and experiences, so they will give equal consideration to the applicant's academic record, personal circumstances and their answers to the questions posed in the application form.

All applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application within 2 weeks after the deadline.

Postgraduate Sanctuary Scholarship 2024/25

INFORMATION

The University offers three Postgraduate Sanctuary Scholarships to support students seeking asylum or with refugee status living in the United Kingdom who are not eligible to receive postgraduate financial support from Student Finance. It covers full tuition costs, plus a maintenance grant of £1,000 per month for 12 months.

ELIGIBILITY

Students must fulfil all criteria below:

- You must have an offer from the University of Westminster for a place on a full-time master's course starting in September 2024 or January 2025
- You must be resident in the UK
- You must hold one of the following eligible immigration statuses before submitting your application
 - UK asylum seeker
 - UK discretionary leave to remain (as a result of an asylum application)
 - UK limited leave to remain (as a result of an asylum application)
 - UK refugee status obtained
- Students who already have a master's degree are not eligible to apply.
- Students who are able to receive taught postgraduate student loans from Student Finance are not eligible to apply
- The following categories of students are not eligible:
 - a. Postgraduate Diploma
 - b. Professional courses (eg RIBA pt III, ACCA, CIMA, CiLEX)
 - c. Conversion courses (eg Graduate Diploma in Law)
 - d. Integrated Masters/MPhil/PhD student
 - e. Part time students

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Applicants must be able to verify their immigration status and are required to provide evidence in the form of a Biometric Residence Permit (BRP), Home Office letter confirming immigration status, Passport with vignettes, Application registration card (asylum).

Please note, once you are awarded a status by the Home Office that allows you access to student finance (tuition fee loans, etc.), you will not receive any outstanding maintenance payment.
